
WARATAH for Kids

GP Information



Through this program, we coordinate a multidisciplinary clinic with a Speech Pathologist and Occupational Therapist – with other services sometimes available on a case-by-case basis.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible for the program, the child must:

- Be aged between 0-7 years old
- Have at least one developmental delay or behaviour concern as diagnosed by GP or a screening tool such as an Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ), or Learn The Signs Act Early (Blue Book)
- Not have seen a Speech Pathologist or Occupational Therapist for an assessment in the last 12 months

Note: Vulnerable children and families will be prioritised.

What regions does it cover?

Only participating GP clinics can refer children into the program. These include:

- Deniliquin Clinic
- Tumut
- Gundagai Medical Centre
- Holbrook Vecare Health
- Hay Medical Centre (and Hay AMS)
- Fitzroy Medical Centre,
